Combining Brand with TADs: Concept, philosophies and an aim to broaden horizons

Any developing science evolves, & so are of the fastest growing dental specialties. Orthodontics has achieved a significant 100-year old milestone in the history of its science. From the very first of landmarks in its evolution, but few may match the clinical impact made by the self-jaligning appliance and the temporary anchorage device.

The aim of all clinical research is to improve the quality of treatment delivered, together with the addition of precision, broadening the horizons of treatment & improve the compliance factor by both the patient & the clinician. The self-jaligning appliance with its self standard as the Elasticity, system has been able to up-level the quality of both the clinician and the patient. On the other hand, the temporary anchorage devices have brought about a renaissance to the field of orthodontics with its concept of absolute anchorage for the past decade. Its an added advancement in the hands of an experienced clinician to overcome one clinical challenge and convert even borderline surgical cases into non-surgical without compromising with the results achieved.

How about combining both TADs & Self-jalign for achieving what was clinically not possible before?

Although not an easy task, but with relevant concepts and added technology it is definitely, the way forward for future. An appliance system is perfect, as both these together can complement each other in overcoming the initial lag phase & giving better boundaries in achieving the ultimate goal- "Toothless".

Class II Correction: Different approaches

Class II malocclusion is one of the most common orthodontic problems that occurs in 1/3rd of the population. Different approaches have been advised to achieve Class II correction. The basic aim is to close a patient's non-compliant appliance to achieve good treatment outcome. Speaker will cover the clinical cases relating the use & biomechanics of micro implants as a method to correct overbite, simultaneous intrusion & retraction and class derotation. The other topic to be covered will be the role of mini-implants in class II correction. Self-jalign will be together to achieve Class II correction in Class I form, thus reducing the need for 3rd space treatment. The presentation will cover the details of AdhAligner2D including appliance placement, biomechanics, case reports and clinical tips.

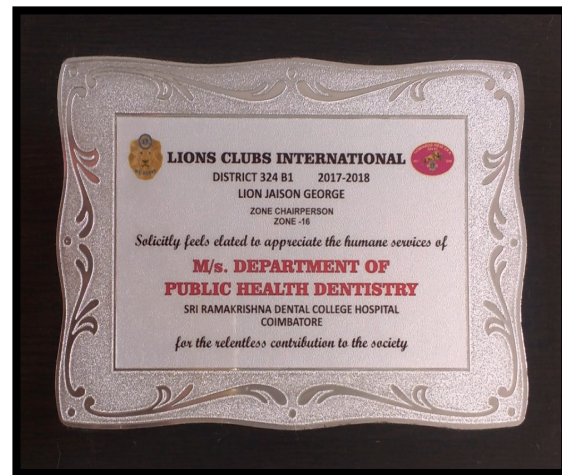

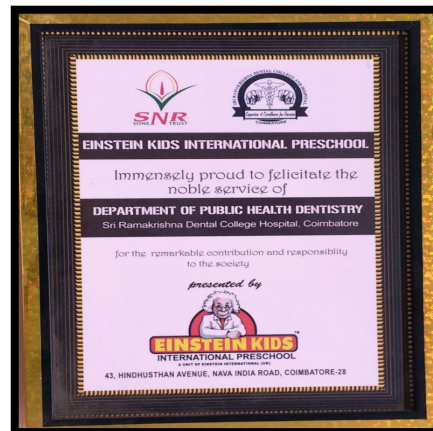

Physical infrastructure

Library: In addition to maintaining the infrastructure, 58 books and 41 journals were added to the existing collection of books and journals. E-consortium with access to 30 journals was provided.

Welfare measures: Well-being of the staff is the dictum of SRDCH. Our prime focus is effective functioning with maximum productivity, the foundation of which is laid by our dedicated & diligent teaching and non teaching staff. The welfare measures of SRDCH include various activities that are directed towards improvement and comfort of employees by offering facilities in addition to salaries. This is framed to ensure that the beneficiaries work in a better environment with high morale and longer retention period. Our objective is to motivate our staff so that they take initiative in accomplishing the tasks with involvement and active participation. This will hence improve individual performance resulting in consistent growth of the institution.

The following are the effective welfare measures for our employees:

1. School Fees Discount of Rs 5000/-intuition fees is provided by SNR Trust CBSE School for wards of teaching and non teaching staff
2. One month salary is redeemed as Diwali bonus for non teaching staff
3. A discount for treatment charges (Dental treatment: 10%, Medical treatment: 15% for teaching and non teaching faculty.
4. Free Beverages of Rs. 416 per month is offered to non teaching staff
5. Accident policy of Rs. 1, 00,000 (for inpatient) per person and Rs. 25,000 (for outpatient) per person is provided for teaching and non teaching staff
6. Free lunch is provided on graduation day for all the students, teaching and non teaching staff
7. Alumni and their family are eligible to avail lifelong treatment concession of 20% at SRDCH & SRH.
8. Onduty leave given to staff for attending Conferences, Exams, Inspections and University meetings.
9. Maternity leave as per government rules to womens staff.

10. Uniform given free of cost for non teaching staff.

Immunization: Year on year Immunization for Hepatitis B is offered for employees and students at a discounted rate (Rs 80/-for 3 doses).
