REPORT

1. 55% of the students responded that they have gained excellent knowledge and skills to manage common dental health problems while 43% felt that their knowledge and skills were good.
2. 56% respondents felt confident that they would be able to apply the principles of ethics and legal requirements in the practice of dentistry while 39% felt fairly capable.
3. 66% of the graduates were very confident to refer patients for specialized treatment while 32% had a fair amount of confidence to do so.
4. 54% professionals had clear cut knowledge to understand, comprehend and interpret data like radiographs while 38% had above average knowledge.
5. 55% of the candidates had outstanding skills to use contemporary technology for documentation and record maintenance while 41% had good technological skills.
6. 45% felt that they had equipped themselves well with the basic principles of practice administration, financial and personnel management of a dental practice while 43% opined that their skills were fair
7. 60% of the students had excellent knowledge about the appropriate methods of waste disposal and infection control whereas 37% felt that their knowledge was good.
8. 57% of the candidates were very confident in their ability to evaluate and implement preventive programs at individual and community level whereas 36% were confident to do so.
9. 57% of respondents had top-notch ability to obtain methodical patient history through thorough clinical examination and arrive at a provisional differential and final diagnosis while 38% had good ability for this
10. 58% had superior skills to carryout appropriate investigations pertaining to the patient & dental condition whereas 36% had good skills
11. 46% opined that they had very good knowledge of the latest trends and technologies in providing dental care while another 46% had good knowledge
12. 66% of the graduates felt they had superlative confidence in their basic skills to deliver quality dental care whereas 32% had good confidence
13. 43% of the participants perceived that they were excellent enough to recognize and manage medical emergencies wherein 44% felt they were good
