Alumni feedback on curriculum and syllabus 2021-22

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of Sri Ramakrishna Dental College and Hospital has continuously been working on quality improvement and betterment of learning experiences. In order to analyse the lag areas of the HEI and explore the scope for further improvement, feedback from the alumni was collected to ascertain if the teaching learning and assessment programme in their alma mater had equipped them to confidently practise dentistry.

In total, 72 Alumni members answered a questionnaire that was provided via a Google form, giving comprehensive feedback which is presented as bar charts.

83.3% of the alumni agreed that the knowledge and skills imparted by the institution had helped them in acquiring good clinical skills and helped them practice confidently in a clinical setup. 80% of the alumni acknowledged that the curriculum and syllabus of the program had helped a lot in acquiring adequate theoretical knowledge. 68% of the alumni felt that they are given adequate opportunity to participate in workshops/ CDE programs/ seminars on knowledge & amp; skill enhancement organized by the college while 23.6 % partially disagreed with that view. 72% of alumni were satisfied with the evaluation mechanism in the college/university.



Other suggestions given are


- a) The examination pattern needs to be changed. MCQ'S to be Included in theory paper. Also detailed examination patterns following OSCE and OSPE norms should be included.
- b) Curriculum changes are the need of the hour. Assessment during their posting rather than 2/3 hour of university exams is ideal.





Student feedback on curriculum and syllabus 2021-22

REPORT

Sri Ramakrishna Dental College and Hospital strives to provide a learner centric educational environment. Therefore, every year feedback of all the students (I BDS to CRI) is obtained to assess the effectiveness of the teaching-learning process in imparting knowledge and skill needed for modern day practice. The complete coverage of syllabus, usage of ICT tools & innovative teaching methodologies were assessed. Adequacy of learning material in E-Learning Portal and library was appraised.

A total number of 432 students gave their valuable feedback by answering a questionnaire sent as a Google form.

90% of students are confident that the course fully covered the syllabus and agreed that use of clinical scenarios and problem based reasoning aroused their interest in the subject. 93% agreed that faculty made use of audio-visual tools such projectors, powerpoint presentations, and clinical case videos.

Only 76% were happy with the teaching material provided in the E-learning portal while 92% agreed that the library had adequate reading material. 83% of students said the teaching methods made them competent and were aligned to skills needed for today's practice.



Faculty feedback on curriculum and syllabus 2021-22

The Sri Ramakrishna Dental College and Hospital works to create a learning atmosphere that is centred on the student. In order to evaluate how well the teaching-learning process is transferring the knowledge and skills required for modern practice, input from all teaching faculty members is gathered each year. The thoroughness of the curriculum's coverage, the ability of the current teaching learning process to be applied in modern day practice and to enhance the employability of the students were questioned.

In total, 71 teaching faculty members answered a questionnaire that was provided via a Google form, giving insightful feedback.

90% of the faculty felt that the teaching learning process is aligned with modern practice requirements and agreed that the curriculum will enable the students to acquire adequate employability skills. 90% of the faculty agreed that the teaching imparted develops fair diagnostic acumen, critical thinking and problem-solving ability in students. 97% said that the college organizes workshops/ CDE/seminars for curriculum enrichment and to improve academic knowledge and clinical skill.



1. Do you feel the teaching learning process is aligned with modern practice requirements and the students will acquire adequate employability skills?




If not, give 2 suggestions to improve the same.

The following are some of the suggestions made by the faculties:

- The curriculum does not involve the current practice trend.
- Teaching pattern needs improvisation as attention not given as comprehensive clinical training for employment to current trend of practice.
- Virtual lab needed and Digital Dentistry
- Students need to be trained practically to handle medical emergencies commonly encountered in dental practice.
- Student exchange programs and refresher course for NEET for CRI
- Recent technologies like 3D treatment planning and advanced treatments like
 Implants and FPD can also be included in the curriculum.

2. Do you think the teaching imparted develops fair diagnostic acumen, critical thinking and problem-solving ability in students?




If not, give 2 suggestions to improve the same.

The following are some of the suggestions made by the faculty members:

- As departmental level teaching is not integrated with comprehensive diagnosis, treatment planning and execution, critical thinking, analysing the best possible outcome and exhibiting skill to solve the problems/ complaints are lacking.
- Training methods have to change to group teaching and completion of procedures in particular academic year
- Assessment in sessional theory and practical can be done based on questions that are problem based
- The students can be provided a way to start looking at every case individually till
 diagnosis and treatment planning, so that their ability to think will improve and not
 see patients just as a way to complete quota.
- Vertical integration is needed has there is no implication of theory knowledge to clinical practice
